RACE REPORT

Once again, Elkhorn Yacht Club put forth a successful event with the Annual Double Angle Race and Dinner. This years' event had 18 boats entered. Seven boats sailed from the Monterey starting point, Twelve were entered to sail from the Santa Cruz starting point, eleven sailed. This year, the courses were adjusted to get boats closer to the wind at the start to improve their chances of a quick race out to MBARI and into Moss Landing. Course relative distances, 22 NM from Monterey, and 26 NM from Santa Cruz.

Winds were relatively light but the big boats seemed to move along quite nicely. At MBARI, Ardea coming from Monterey and Merlin coming from Santa Cruz rounded in close proximity. Merlin enjoyed the benefit of a mast high spinnaker which gave it the edge for the final legs of the course. Merlin took the honors for first to finish overall, uncorrected. Interesting enough, the last boat to finish from the Santa Cruz course, corrected out to finish in first place, a Moore 24, skippered by Scott Nelson. Following in second place Merlin, skippered by Bill Lee. And coming in third: Samiko, skippered by John Allison. Samiko last graced EYC when they participated and took first place in the Otter Cup.

The Monterey course was swept by Monterey Boats this year.

Ardea, skippered by Augie Lewis taking first, (EYC member Darryl Prudden aboard), Morpheus skippered by Rick Srigley taking second, Maverick, skippered by Juan du Preez, taking third, (EYC member Richard Barnard aboard). EYC had five vessels representing, but they were unable to out do the opponents this time around.

Following the race, dinner and race awards took place. Several members of both the Monterey Club and Santa Cruz club stayed enjoyed the hospitality and scenic beauty of EYC. Approximately 115 diners were served, the bar was three deep often during the evening, apparel sales manned by Scott Richert, with theme shirts and sweatshirts were hot. I'd like to mention the number of folks it takes to pull off this event....

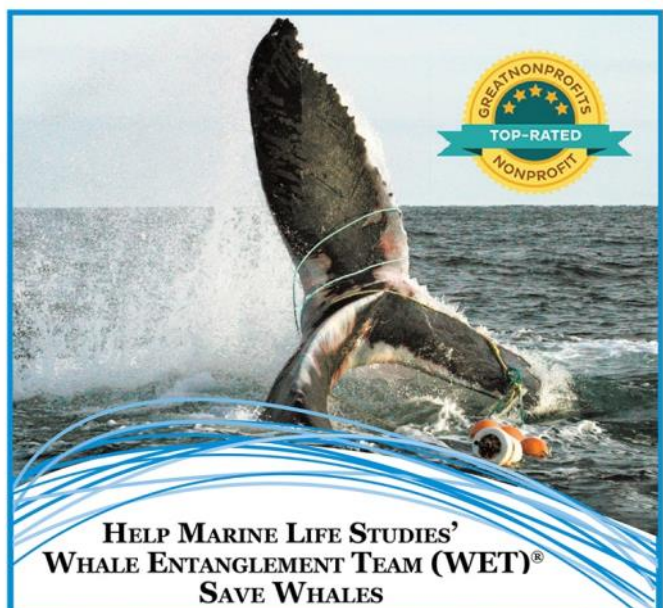
