Seawall Assessment - Rita Jacques

As many of our club members have noticed over the last few months, there are sections of our seawall that are showing some deterioration. The Long Range Planning Committee, with your Board's approval, has undertaken some research to determine the seriousness of the deterioration and whether it proposes any threat to our property.

First, a bit of history. The seawall was originally built by club members. Within a short time after it was built, a dredger anchored itself behind the wall and seriously damaged the wall directly in front of the club house. The consequent repairs were done by contract.

The Long Range Planning committee reached out to two of the contractors who were involved in the repair for an assessment of the current deterioration. The questions were:

1. Is there imminent danger of the seawall failing?
2. What is the estimate for a repair/ reinforcement of the seawall?

The team that has assessed the wall is:

Matthew Kyle, at Kyle engineering

John Kasunich at Haro Kasunich geotechnical engineering

Rick Fuller at Sunstone construction Inc Rick Fuller and John Kasunich were the team on the original repair.

The assessment is that there is no imminent danger of the wall failing.

The Veeder Cup was first held in 1964 as a match race among the four Monterey Bay yacht clubs, which include Stillwater YC of Pebble Beach, Elkhorn YC of Moss Landing, SCYC of Santa Cruz, and MPYC of Monterey. This year's team representing EYC is team captain Lara Jacques, trimmer Diana Garrett, and foredeck/moveable rail meat Dan Garrett. Already the team has been practicing together and individually sailing Santana 22s in the 2022 Santana Nationals in Monterey, Santanarama in Stillwater Cove, MPYC one-design races, dinghy classes, and team sail/drills on the Diving Dolphin (on loan from MPYC race director Justin Nielsen). Races will be held over Labor Day weekend for the right to challenge current Veeder Cup defender MPYC (<https://www.latitude38.com/electronic/all-female-crew-defends-veeder-cup/>). Double Angle Recap



The last Invitational of our race season, the “Double Angle”, was held on August 27th and once again thanks to great volunteers it was a rousing success. For those not familiar with the Double Angle I should explain that it is really sort of three races, starting at our two “sister” clubs (MPYC and SCYC), ending at EYC with a great party. As the description states “... three clubs, two starts, one

1) **FIRST TO FINISH**. This is the one race where the two starts are pitted against each other. One goal - be the first boat to cross the finish line (no handicaps applied)! Great history involving some great boats and skippers. For quite awhile the course record was held by the legendary “Merlin”. Boats came close to breaking the record (within 20 seconds) but until 2020 nobody could best it. In 2020 “Mighty Duck” blasted the record by over 3 minutes and to be honest we all thought that that time would hold for at least a few years. Boy were we wrong. In 2022 Edward Marez and the crew of “Buono Sera” crossed the line with a time of 2hrs 59min 15 seconds and broke not only the record but the 3 hour mark! While there was no new record this year, **“First to Finish” was won by “Solstice” skippered by Michael Polkalba (MPYC)**. After asking around I believe that this is the first time a boat with a handicap rating over 100 has captured “First to Finish” (remember - no handicap is applied). **WELL DONE MICHAEL!!!**

2) Monterey Start. 9 boats in three over three different fleets. In **PHRF A** (handicaps of 125 or less) the 3 boats from MPYC ended up with corrected finish times within about 14 minutes of each other. In addition to winning "First to Finish" Michael Polkabl ("Solstice") also won first place in PHRF A. Second place went to Jean duPreez and the crew of "Maverick". The third place finisher was the story though. Paul Brocchini and his boat "Athena" had not raced at all in a very, very, very long time. With some loving conjouling by really strong MPYC racers, who all agreed to crew for him, Paul agreed to race "Athena" once again. "Solstice" and "Athena" battled from ML4 to the finish with "Athena" finishing just 1 minute 47 seconds behind "Solstice" for "First to Finish". After the handicaps were applied "Athena" took third place in the A fleet. I don't think I am the only one who hopes that we see Paul and "Athena" in future races! **PHRF B** (126 or greater) had a mix of 5 boats from Elkhorn and Monterey. Jeff Kise and the crew of "Calphurnia" once again left no doubt on their way to first place - their time not only scored them first in PHRF B but would have gotten them third in PHRF A. Second place was Justin Nielson and the crew of "Diving Dolphin" with a time of 4:09:35. Lara Jacques and the crew of "Solace" took third. Sydney Drake and the crew of "Un Bel Di" took fourth and Ryan McMillen and the crew of "New Wave placed fifth. In the **Multi-hull** division Ben Carver took both "First to Finish Multi-hull" and first place in the division. Congratulations!

3) Santa Cruz Start. 11 boats...3 fleets. **PHRF A** (125 or less) had great group 8 SCYC boats. In another "left no doubt" finish Lou Pambianco and the crew of "Heartbeat" came in first with a time of 4:18:54. Second, with a time of 4:53:04, was Tom Faraola/Mark Merritt and the crew of "New Wave". John Martinelli/Paul Stone and the crew of "Kemosabe" crossed in third with a time of 5:06:48. Finishing out the group was Sergei Podshivalov and crew on "Javelin" (4th), Geoff Boraston/Peter Woodhouse and crew on "Amor Fati" (5th), Jim Weaver/Hilary Weaver and crew on Tusitala (6th), Michael Hutchison and crew on "Aquavit" 7th, and Brad Sampson and crew on "Hijinx" (8th). **PHRF B** (126 or greater) saw Dan Garrett and the crew of "Cutlass" taking first with a time of 5:43:56. Second place went to Alexander Mirfield and his crew on "good Timin". In the Multi-hull division Nick Halmos on "Calonectris" had to retire.
